

# Return to School Plan 2020-21

Shiloh United School

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## Intro

There are Four Pillars that the County of San Mateo Health Dept are suggesting: Health and Hygiene, Face Coverings, Physical Distancing, and Limiting Gatherings.

## Steps to Reopening at the Beginning of the School Year

### Step One (Minimum of three weeks)

- County health conditions: the number of COVID-19 positive cases in the county remains flat or decreasing
- Allow no on-campus visitors including volunteers; parents who support direct instruction in preschool classrooms are exempt
- Pause all extracurricular activities
- Pause all gatherings (a gathering is any meeting or social activity outside of classroom instruction that includes more than four people)
- Convene all meetings remotely
- Reinforce the wearing of face coverings by staff, students, and any others who enter the campus

### Step Two (Minimum of three weeks)

- County health conditions: the number of COVID-19 positive cases in the county remains flat or decreasing
- Open the campus only to visitors and volunteers who directly support instruction with expectations that all will honor the Four Pillars
- Restrict extracurricular activities to those that directly support and intersect with instruction, with expectations that any in-person activities will honor the Four Pillars

### Step Three: (Minimum of three weeks)

- County health conditions: the number of COVID-19 positive cases in the county remains flat or decreasing
- Allow volunteers and visitors on campus with strict adherence to the Four Pillars
- Restrict instructional and interest-based extracurricular activities to those that can be implemented with small groups who can physically distance

- If county health orders allow, convene high priority gatherings comprised of no more than 50 people, including sport and performance-based activities that can be conducted within the guidance of the Four Pillars

## Health and Hygiene

### Protocols:

- If students are not feeling well, please keep them home.
- Students will have a health check upon entering campus to confirm they are feeling well. If they indicate they are not feeling well, they can opt for their temperature to be taken.
- Every person on campus will have access to Essential Protective Equipment (EPE) includes face coverings, and hand sanitizer.
- Parent volunteers and all campus visitors will have temperature checks regularly.
- There will be Limited Sharing of Material and Equipment.
- Ventilation will be increased.
- Surfaces that are used will be cleaned daily.

## Face Coverings

Unless compromised everyone will wear a face covering while walking across school grounds, and in common areas of the campus.

## Physical Distancing

There will be marks on the ground in classrooms that designate space for the teacher.

If anyone is not feeling well at any point in the day, they will go to a room for resting while they await a ride home.
